KRS 315.010(25) defines a prescription drug order to include protocols authorized by the Board of Pharmacy. | Current protocols approved include: Point-of-care testing and treatment of influenza, streptococcal pharyngitis, and acute uncomplicated urinary tract infection; Screening for colorectal cancer, HIV, Hepatitis C infection and tuberculosis; Treatment of opioid use disorder with LA naltrexone; Tobacco cessation counseling and medication management; Travel health therapies; Allergic rhinitis management; Management of self-care conditions related to emergency contraception, diabetes, nutritional supplementation and probiotic therapies.
